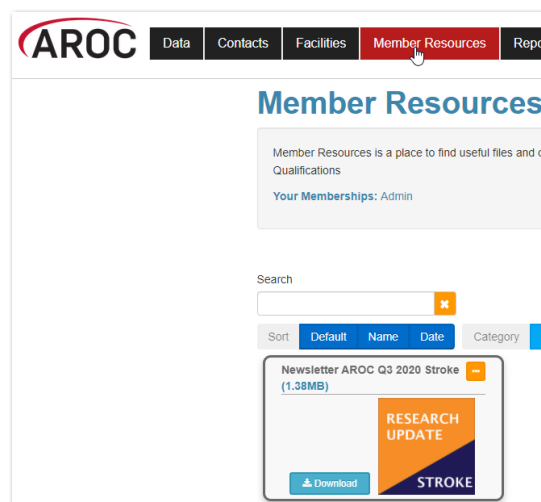

NEW - Live Reporting Feature AOS

Live Reporting allows AROC members to log in and view a series of graphs that show a summary of their live data any time they wish. These plots can be manipulated to contain any time period of data and can be interacted with in a number of ways. The resulting graphs can also be downloaded into a report format for use offline. AROC plans to continue developing this feature by improving the current application and adding new applications with varying levels of analysis. You can access it right now by logging into AOS and selecting “Live Reporting” under the “Reporting” heading. When you first access the application you will be guided through a tour which will highlight how to best use the application. If you accidentally exit the tour, it can be restarted by selecting the question mark (?) in the top right hand corner of the screen.



Clinical Queries & Explanations

Toileting

Question: Is there consideration for flushing the toilet in FIM?

Answer: There is no consideration for flushing a toilet in FIM.

Bath/Shower Transfers

Question: A patient uses a self-propelled mobile shower chair to independently access the shower cubicle, but initially transfers from their wheelchair to the mobile shower chair using a rail and with steadying assistance from 1 helper - what would their FIM score be?

Answer: Dependent on where the transfer onto the mobile shower chair happens. For Bath/Shower Transfer the assessment commences once inside the bathroom door. If transferring to the mobile shower chair elsewhere (other than in the bathroom), it is scored with chair to chair transfer. Only take into account the help, if any, required inside the bathroom. For the Bath/Shower Transfer Item - independently sitting on the shower chair and use of the rail would equal a score of 6; however, with hands on assistance (steadying) to transfer onto the self-propelled mobile shower chair the score drops to a 4.

Locomotion

Question: If a patient navigates 12 stairs going up and down on their bottom rather than walking up or down, how do we score them?

Answer: They can score a 7. Bottom stair climbing is acceptable. Additionally, when 'Bottom-climbing' stairs, assistance in and out of a wheelchair is not part of the Stairs scoring.

Expression

Question: If a patient has a tracheostomy and currently needs a communication aid to independently express themselves, do they score a 6 or do they score a 1 if their usual mode of expressing themselves is verbally (with the expectation that at the end of their rehab they will be expressing verbally).

Answer: It is about the present. If they require a device/aid and can express at a complex level (without any help to use the device/aid or prompting), they can score a 6 – modified independence. If they can express themselves at a complex level, however require help or prompting - the starting score is a 5.

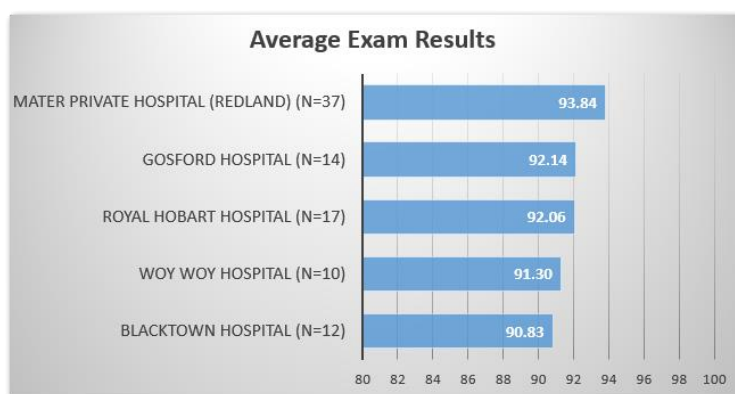
NB: Comprehension and Expression items on admission do not have to match the mode at discharge (as in the Walk/Wheelchair item).
