Improving Palliative Aged Care in the Home-based Setting

The Palliative Aged Care Outcomes Program (PACOP)–Home Care Project is a national research initiative led by the University of Wollongong, aiming to adapt and evaluate the PACOP–Home Care Model for home-based aged care services. The PACOP has been successfully implemented in residential aged care homes across Australia. As more older Australians preferring to receive care at home, this project will develop a modified, home-care-specific PACOP model. It aims to seek to support aged care providers by embedding a standardised, evidence-based model to assess client needs, plan care, and monitor quality outcomes in home-based aged care settings.

We are currently inviting expressions of interest from aged care services across Australia to be part of:

Development Phase – Contribute your expertise and insights to co-design the PACOP–Home Care Model, assessment tools, and implementation strategies.
