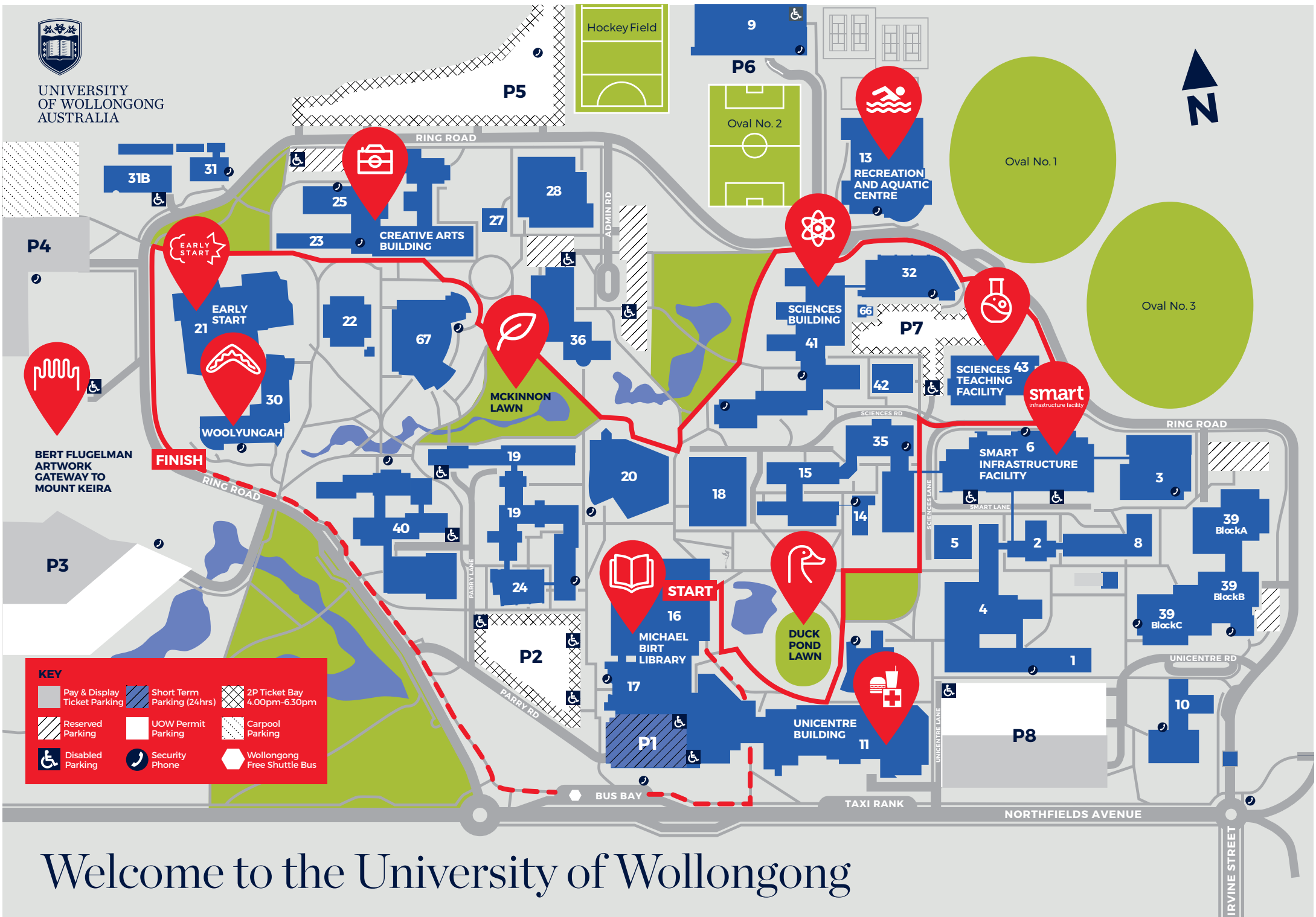

## START MICHAEL BIRT LIBRARY - BUILDING 16

The Michael Birt library provides a wealth of knowledge with half a million books, DVD's and a large display of major artworks. These artworks can be discovered on all 3 floors of the library and consist of works from Guy Warren, Bert Flugelman and Ian Gentle. The library also hosts exhibitions, which occur seasonally in the Panizzi room located on the ground floor.



## UNICENTRE - BUILDING 11

Home to the University Hall, main food court, Medical & Dental clinic, UniShop, Post Office and the UniBar, UniCentre gives students and our communities a place to shop or seek advice.



## DUCK POND LAWN

Situated in the heart of the campus is the Duck Pond Lawn. This area hosts many student life activities with its large grassy area and stage. It is the location of the Founding Donors' memorial bench unveiled in 1978 recognising donations from local industries and philanthropic fundraising following a Mayoral appeal.



## SMART INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITY - BUILDING 6

The Simulation, Modelling, Analysis, Research & Teaching Infrastructure Facility is an important National Research Institution, purposed with developing a new branch of research called 'Integrated Infrastructure Planning and Management.'



## SCIENCES TEACHING FACILITY - BUILDING 43

This three-level, 7,000 square metre Sciences Teaching Facility, allows for the flexible delivery of a number of laboratory classes from biology, to chemistry and the earth and environmental sciences. The grandeur of this building allows for individual classes to hold 240 students at one time.



## UNIVERSITY RECREATION AND AQUATIC CENTRE (URAC) - BUILDING 13

URAC provides the Wollongong community with top-class fitness and sporting facilities including: a 50m outdoor, heated, fully supervised Olympic pool, air-conditioned health club, tertiary qualified staff, the latest Life Fitness equipment and over 50 group exercise classes a week.



## SCIENCES BUILDING - BUILDING 41

In the foyer of the Sciences Building is the Howard Worner Rock and Mineral Collection that was donated by the late Howard Worner. It is also home to the exhibition identified as "the scientific find of the century," known as the 'Hobbit.'



## MCKINNON LAWN

The McKinnon lawn is a scenic passage way between building 19 (Arts), building 36 (Administration) and building 67 (McKinnon). This impressive landscape attracts many native birds and provides grassy areas for students, staff and community members to sit and take in the sounds of the creeks and waterways.



## TAEM GALLERY CREATIVE ARTS - BUILDING 25

Building 25 is home to the The School of Arts, English and Media (TAEM) Gallery on Level 1. This gallery is a space for students, staff and visiting visual art and design exhibitions. The gallery is open to the public during business hours.



## EARLY START DISCOVERY SPACE - BUILDING 21

Early Start offers a world class children's research facility and Discovery Space. This facility is transforming teaching, research and community engagement. The Discovery Space is open to the public and we encourage you to visit with children from birth to the age of 12.



## BERT FLUGELMAN ARTWORK - GATEWAY TO MOUNT KEIRA

Located off the ring road between the Western and South-Western Carparks, stands the Bert Flugelman Artwork, "Gateway to Mount Keira" also known as "Wave".



## FINISH WOOLYUNGAH INDIGENOUS CENTRE - BUILDING 30

Woolyungah Indigenous Centre is the University's Centre for Indigenous student recruitment, access and support. Its programs aim to foster equity by supporting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people with entry to university, tutoring services and successful completion of their degree.
