WHAT IS UOWX

UOWx connects students with valuable co-curricular activities offered both at the University of Wollongong and within the local community. The personal and professional development that you gain through these activities, along with your active citizenship, is formally recognised through the UOWx Record and UOWx Award when you graduate.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF GRADUATING WITH UOWX RECOGNITION?

If everyone has a degree, how do employers choose who gets the job? Students who receive a UOWx Record or UOWx Award have demonstrated their commitment to gaining experience and skills outside of their academic coursework so they can stand out from other applicants when they graduate.

Activities that are recognised by UOWx have been assessed against a robust framework, to ensure the development of key employability skills. UOWx recognised activities are identified as significantly contributing to the personal and professional development of students, giving them the edge in a competitive global workforce.

HOW TO APPLY

UOW students who undertake volunteering with a local community organisation can apply to have their engagement listed on their UOWx Record.

In order to qualify to have your experience listed on your UOWx Record, follow this easy 3 step process:

1. Complete a minimum of 20+ hours of volunteering within a calendar year with your chosen organisation
2. Provide your supervisor at the community organisation with a verification letter so they can verify your involvement and demonstrate the learning and training you received. The verification letter is available on the UOWx website.
3. Complete the external volunteering recognition claim form on the UOWx website where you will be asked to reflect and demonstrate your learning in the UOWx Learning Streams.
