Dr Peter Draper has been a fixture at the University of Hull for many years, but never tires of learning new things, crossing new boundaries, and inspiring students and colleagues to look at the world in a different way.

In this presentation Peter will explore paths to becoming a SoTL scholar, drawing on his personal experience over the last 5 years. In this time, Peter has developed from being a nursing academic with significant teaching responsibilities and a track record of disciplinary research, to his current situation as a nationally recognized scholar of teaching and learning with a small but growing portfolio of international projects and research-based SoTL publications.

Peter will talk about the importance of knowing and telling your story; achieving recognition through institutional and national schemes; being an innovative teacher and being known as an innovative teacher; learning from your mistakes (that will be a long section!); using disciplinary approaches to work in interdisciplinary ways; and successfully marketing yourself.

Peter's presentation will be informal with lots of opportunities for questions and participation.

Peter is a UK National Teaching Fellow and a Principal Fellow of the Higher Education Academy. Recent publications include a report contributing to the Higher Education Academy's 'Innovative Pedagogies' project (in press) and a report for the Leadership Foundation for Higher Education on the experiences of innovators in learning and teaching (in press). Peter's current work involves a project to promote the scholarship of learning and teaching in his home Faculty.
