



Access to EIS Laboratory Procedure

1. Complete online EIS Induction Assessment Quiz. The quiz uses the Moodle platform and questions are based on the EIS Laboratory Safety Manual. A UOW user name and password will be required to complete the quiz. A certificate is produced once a pass mark has been achieved.

For access to Environmental Engineering laboratories in Buildings 6 and 8, the online Biosafety Training Course must also be completed in addition to the EIS Induction Assessment Quiz. A certificate is also produced once a pass mark has been achieved. [Enrolment key – Biosafety]

The EIS Laboratory Safety Manual, EIS Induction Assessment Quiz and Biosafety Training Course are all located on the EIS Health and Safety web page under “Laboratory Safety”.
