



Understanding visitor and resident usage and experiences of green space in the Liverpool CBD: a research survey by The University of Wollongong.

Dear Respondent,

The purpose of this study is to understand visitor and resident experiences of public green spaces (including parks, cycle ways, street trees, ovals, cemeteries or gardens) in the Liverpool CBD. This survey aims to understand your experience of the Liverpool CBD, and how you use and experience the green spaces that are currently present. We are also interested in how you think these spaces might be improved.

Who is conducting the survey?

Jenny Atchison, Hugh Forehead, Kris French, Cole Hendrigan, Louella McCarthy, Thomas Astell-Burt, Eliza de Vet and Johan Bathelemy are researchers interested in environmental change and urban landscapes.

What are the outcomes of the research?

Answering these questions will help us build a picture of community views on green space in urban areas in Australia. It will also enable a better understanding of how green spaces might be improved for the future.

Who will see my answers?

The survey is anonymous. No one will know who submitted surveys, unless they wish to identify themselves. If you choose to enter the draw to win one of two \$500 Coles gift cards, the personal information collected for this purpose will be stored separately from your survey answers.

Do I have to participate?

As a volunteer participant, you can choose to opt out at any time or not participate at all. If you wish to opt out, you may simply close the survey page at any time. Alternatively you may write to the researchers and request to withdraw and have your data withdrawn – note that this is only possible if you have provided contact details to enter the draw. We plan to use the findings of this research at conferences, reports and in academic publications.
