WHAT SHOULD YOU DO IF YOU SUSPECT POOR ACADEMIC PRACTICE OR ACADEMIC MISCONDUCT?

If you think a student has engaged in behaviour which may constitute poor academic practice or academic misconduct, it is important to report the case via the online Academic Misconduct Management System. Reporting instances of poor academic practice or academic misconduct assists in identifying students who are at risk and may require additional support and also sends a clear message to students that such behaviour is unacceptable.
