Postgraduate study at UOW is now more affordable, with Commonwealth supported places available for all post-graduate coursework in 2025.

Commonwealth supported places

A Commonwealth supported place (CSP) is a university place where, for eligible domestic students, tuition fees are made up of two parts:

- A contribution by the Australian Government (for some courses, up to three-quarters of the tuition fee is funded by the Australian Government)
- A contribution by the student (which, depending on eligibility, may be deferred, and repaid later via a HECS-HELP loan or, paid upfront).

Your eligibility is automatically considered when we assess your application.

If you are an Australian citizen, a New Zealand Citizen, a Permanent Resident, or a holder of a permanent humanitarian visa, you're more than halfway to meeting the eligibility criteria for a CSP.

Eligible students may also be able to access HECS-HELP to defer all or part of their course fees.

Courses

UOW offers a range of postgraduate courses to suit your future career and your commitments.

Graduate certificates

A graduate certificate is a great option for people looking to advance their career in a shorter time frame. These can be completed in six months full-time, or part-time equivalent and are made up of four subjects.

Upon successful completion of a graduate certificate, you may be eligible for credit for up to four subjects* when you enrol in a graduate diploma and/or master's degree.

Graduate diplomas

A graduate diploma is a one-year full-time, or part-time equivalent course. Students who have already completed the graduate certificate will receive credit for up to four subjects completed.*

Master's programs

A master's degree from UOW gives you a competitive edge over other employees, with master's graduates earning on average 36 per cent more than their undergraduate colleagues.¹

Flexible delivery

Most courses are available full-time or part-time so that you can fit study around your work or family commitments.

Students who are working full time often study part-time, choosing to complete one to two subjects per semester, taking three years to complete a master's degree.
